A presentation was given by Haline Li from Popper Box outlining the consultation process used by Popper Box to elicit community inspiration for the proposed public art for the SSFL in the Fairfield CLG area.

Following the completion of this phase of consultation, three proposed designs will be presented to the Fairfield City Council and the CLG (for selection of a final design) in May 2011.

Carramar residents have been doorknocked by Donna Sowry from ARTC and Haline Li from Popperbox. Donna Sowry will do follow up door knocks in the next two weeks.

Donna Sowry from ARTC and Wil Loeng from Popperbox will attend the Villawood Senior Citizens Group next week to further discussion the project.

Schools in the area have been consulted.

Additional responses will be sought from Chamber of Commerce, Neighbourhood Watch and Senior Citizens in meetings in February. The Polish Club will be followed up by Donna Sowry.

3A Rail

Q: - What impacts will there be on traffic?

A: - There will be jersey barriers on the side of the road.

Q: - What are the purposes of the barriers?

A: - They are crash barriers.

Broomfield Street - Sewer Main Diversion

As per the presentation

The start date for the works has been changed to late April/Early May and was rescheduled due to supply of pipes and operational issues.

There have been some changes to the design due to operational considerations.

Q: - Who has given the OK on the new design? Will there be any extra impacts?

A: - There will be less potential impacts than the previous design.

Stations First

Cabramatta Station.

Update of the Cabramatta Station works given as per the presentation.

Broomfield Street – Kerbing and Parking

As per the presentation. Work in the area was rescheduled away from Chinese New Year

Q: - Will there be parking for the shops while this work is going on?

A: - There will be temporary loading bays supplied



A request by the Chamber of Commerce for the property manager of the affected shops to be consulted. ARTC will do so.

Q: - Will there be no net loss of parking?

A: - There will be no net loss of parking in the precinct.

Comment was made by the community representatives that the new parking is further away and will affect the shops in this area.

Q: - Why is the parking being closed.

A: - To construct new kerb lines.

Q: - When will the work be completed?

A: - 28th February.

Coral Reynolds of Stations First has consulted extensively with the shops in the area prior to the work being carried out.

He noted that the RTA had not approved this and advised the CLG that he had an issue with this.
