### 1. Welcome, introductions, previous meeting record and matters arising - Chair

The Chair welcomed meeting attendees and made introductions.

The meeting record was endorsed.

There were no matters arising from the minutes not otherwise listed on the agenda

## **2. Constructor Introduction**

Mr Daniel Rose from Gartner Rose and Chris Kyriacou from Seymour White outlined the construction timetable and current pre-start activities.

It was noted that the CLG had previously requested a time line of the works, updated monthly and asked if it could also be uploaded onto the website. The Project Director agreed to do this.

## **3. Community Amenity Offset Plan – Prue Hodgson, Community Liaison Manager**

The requirements of the federal approval were outlined. The Community Liaison Manager noted the consultation activities regarding the Environmental Action Plan and the Community Amenity Offset Plan. ARTC introduced the CLG to their Web site re-design.

Prue pointed out that the closing date for submissions in the 10<sup>th</sup> October 2008 and invited members of the CLG to provide comments that she would note as a submission. Council representatives emphasised that because of the council elections this coming weekend it had been difficult to obtain input from the newly elected representatives. Campbelltown Council had its first council meeting yesterday. It was agreed that a submission could be provided by the 10<sup>th</sup> October with the proviso that further information may be submitted shortly afterwards. ARTC confirmed that as long as any additional information was received within 1-2 weeks after the close of submissions it would be taken into account.

Comments:

Graffiti management is a priority for Campbelltown & Liverpool Council. It was noted that some of the proposed treatments for noise walls such as encouraging the growth of vines was designed with graffiti control primarily in mind.

Car parking – It was noted by ARTC that they are not obliged to make up shortfalls in existing parking but rather to replace parking lost. Where car parking has been optimised by Council, however, ARTC can make a financial contribution to Council to offset car spaces lost.

It was commented by Liverpool Council representative that noise walls would be more appropriately included in the Environmental Action Plan than the Community Amenity Offset Plan.

The question was asked if everything had been decided about landscaping. ARTC described the process including early consultation of councils to establish the design palette. Detailed design is now in process.

It was confirmed that this project is completely independent of the South West Rail Link.

#### **4. General Business**

Future of the Liverpool/Campbelltown CLG.

The ICLR raised the issue of the low level of community participation in the Liverpool/Campbelltown CLG. Only two community representatives are members of the CLG and generally only one community representative attended.

The ICLR invited discussion on the future viability of this CLG on the basis that this level of community participation does not represent the views and interests of the broader community and involves significant resources that could be better deployed in alternate consultation activities.

During discussion it was noted that the sole community member attending the meeting this evening is resigning from the CLG. The only other stakeholder participants are Council representatives who meet regularly with ARTC. Council representatives agreed that there were better alternative methods to consult the community that more accurately targeted the target audience and agreed that the CLG should be disbanded. The Chair supported the future viability of the CLG and suggested that Council may play a part in seeking to recruit members. It was confirmed that ARTC has worked closely with Council without success to increase representation, including canvassing sporting clubs and a broad range of community organisations.

The ICLR noted that there are a number of other consultation mechanisms that are likely to have more success in engaging community input such as occasional staffed displays in regional centres.

It was agreed that the ICLR would discuss this matter with the Department of Planning and report back at the next meeting.
