1. Welcome, introductions, apologies

The Chair welcomed meeting attendees and made introductions.

2. Previous Minutes record and matters arising

Q: - Why is noise mitigation of the Powerhouse Access road not in the scope of the project?

A: - Access must be provided to the powerhouse precinct. Noise mitigation of the existing road is not a part of the project scope.

Q: - If it is a condition of DECC for noise mitigation as a part of the project then the new road becomes a part of the traffic guidelines?

A: - DECC noise mitigation guidelines are Noise Guidelines for Rail Projects, so noise in association to rail traffic.

Q: - Can the road be built lower?

A: - It is not possible to lower the road.

Q: - Why didn't ARTC build a Gabion wall through the area?

A: - Construction of a Gabion wall is restricted by the loading on the wall.

Q: - Where are you creating a retention basin?

A: - A flood management study has been done. Details of the study will be taken on notice.

Q: - In the previous minutes, section 5, question 2, the question was asked if in ARTC opinion, concrete sleepers are quieter than timber sleepers. What is the basis of this opinion?

A: - ARTC has a standard policy that concrete sleepers will be used in the construction of new tracks.

Q: - What is the speed of the new track?

A: - 80 K/Hr north of Glenfield and 100K/Hr south of Glenfield.

Q: - What is the noise measurement of daytime compared to night time levels?

A: - The noise monitoring reporting has been as per the DECC Noise Guidelines, which measures a 24 hour average, rather than a night level and day time level.
