

EXTENSION OF EXHIBITION PERIOD

Proposed Southern Sydney Freight Line

Reference	05-0089
Location	The Southern Sydney Freight Line (SSFL) would comprise a single dedicated rail freight track, extending from south of Macarthur to east of the Sefton Park junction. The new track, 30km in length within a 36km railway corridor, would be located on the western side of the existing RailCorp passenger lines between Macarthur and the junction with the East Hills Line at Glenfield. At Glenfield it would cross over via a new grade-separated interchange, known as the Glenfield flyover, and continue through to Sefton on the eastern and southern side of the passenger lines.
